



Spring Cleaning

DONE	Grooming Box	NOTES
	Inventory Brushes and throw out old or broken	
	Clean grooming tools and let air dry	Vinegar, Dawn dish soap, Listerine
	Scrub clean brush box	
	Replace with new if necessary	
	Check over First aid supply replenish if needed	Check expiration dates
	Sharpen clipper blades	
	Clean towels	
DONE	Tack and Equipment	NOTES
	Blankets (Have them cleaned and repaired)	
	Check over tack/halters (check threads and for cracks in leather send for repairs if needed)	A good saddler will check over tack for you if you have questions and will tell you what to watch for and will fix for safety if needed at a reasonable price
	Evaluate Saddle fit (Horse's body changes with work load)	
	Check your billets on your saddle	
	Clean Saddle pads	
	Clean and inspect boots or wraps	
	Donate or sell unused equipment	
	Clean bits	Listerine, Water, Dishwasher (sanitize)
DONE	Horse	NOTES
	Shoeing change (Change in shoe due to work or frequency of visit with growth rate)	Talk to farrier
	Spring shots	
	Fecal test (worming)	
	Look at body condition score	Decide if horse should have muzzle or diet change (ask Vet)
	Tackle shedding (is horse shedding normaly?)	
	Clean up leg hair	
	Check for Fungal or bacterial issues (Catch early)	
	Look at exercise program	If you havent ridden start horse back slowly. Make a plan
	Clean sheath	
	Dental if needed	
DONE	Trailer	NOTES
	Power wash trailer	
	Check Tires, brakes, hitch, lights	Have tire kit in trailer or truck
	Get inspection	
	Clean inside walls and dividers	Checkv for bee hives from last year and remove
	Add fresh shavings if used	
	Clean hay bags or feeders	
	Clean tack room	
	Check supplies	Extra halter, lead, first aid
